



Job Title: Speech Language Pathologist

Description of Job: To provide services and support for students, in all areas of speech and language development, as they impact educational functioning

Performance Responsibilities:

- To provide screening, identification, assessment, diagnosis, treatment, intervention and follow-up services for disorders of speech/language and communication
- To work with parents, colleagues, and supervisors to develop and maintain a positive learning environment
- To maintain useful and accurate records and documentation including schedules, case notes, service logs and other records
- To facilitate a collaborative relationship between general education, special education, and other related service providers
- To utilize current research to determine effective diagnostic and treatment procedures and measure outcomes of treatment and conduct continuing evaluation of the efficacy practices and programs to maintain and improve quality of services
- Consider students developmental factors when interpreting evaluation data and designing interventions
- To provide services that demonstrate multicultural sensitivity to students and their families and consider student's ability in their primary and secondary languages and the effects of the second language learning when designing assessments and planning interventions
- To interpret and use assessment data for the purpose of making appropriate modifications in the learning environment and planning effective instruction
- To assist in determining the least restrictive environment to provide services based upon the needs of the individual student
- Identify and engage in appropriate continuing education opportunities to support personal development as a learning educator
- Use a variety of communication modes to effectively communicate with a diverse student population, parents and other professionals
- Assist in the planning and implementation of AAC/AT devices
- To complete other duties and responsibilities as assigned
